IGU NORTH ZONE

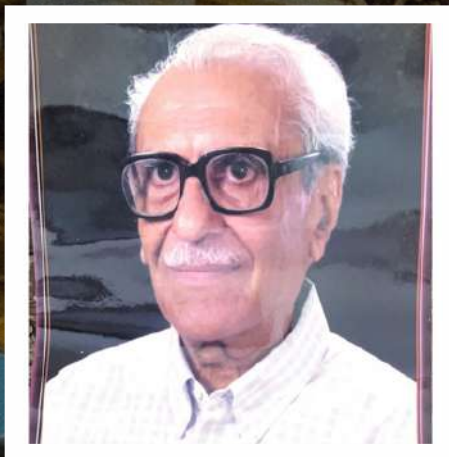

SHUBHANKAR SHARMA TOURNAMENT

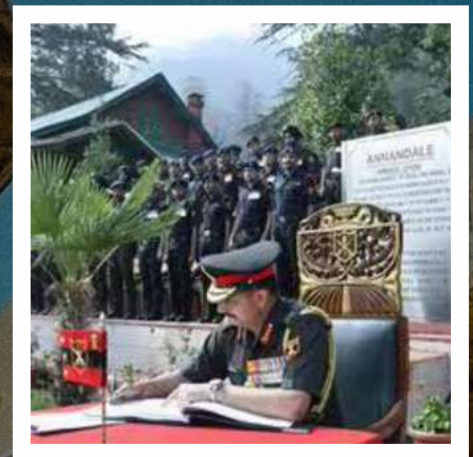
On 24 April, a group of 30 talented junior golfers showcased their golfing skills on Mayo College's 9-hole par 34 course!

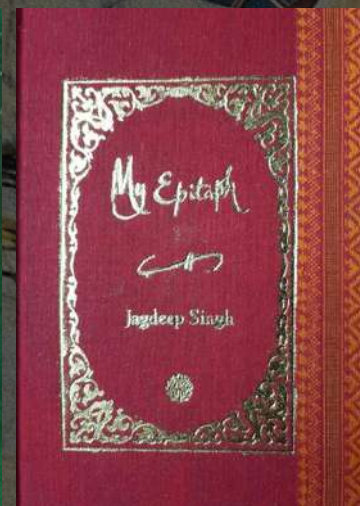

A group of students from Mayo College restored a village water tank, ensuring clean drinking water for villagers.



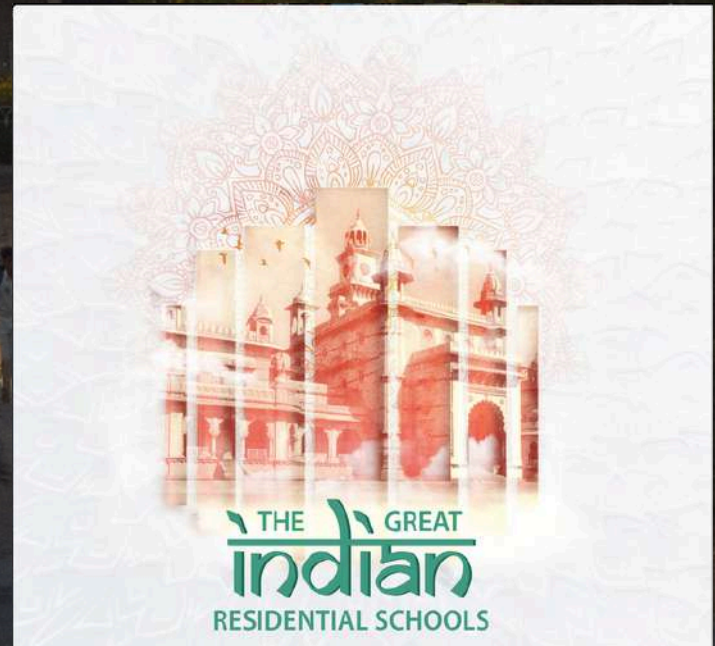
WORLD EARTH DAY
